From the Desk of The Rev. Joe Pierjok



They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit. - Jeremiah 17:8

The most important words to say in Church are “thank you.” Say it often, and mean it, and today I say it to you. Thank you for the many gifts that you share with our community.

You have heard the familiar expression “can’t see the forest for the trees” before. We most often use it to describe that occasion in which we lose sight of the big picture while focusing on the details. From my position, I often experience the blessing of being able to see the big picture of our congregation – the ministry we bring to our neighbors, the impact we have on our community, the ways that week after week we come together to celebrate our faith and praise God. This is the forest.

And I get to wander amongst the trees. From the small shoot reaching out from its seed and finding the sunlight, to the mightiest tree, standing tall, showing strength, offering sheltering love to those who need it. You are those trees, each drawing strength from our meal and showering the world with the love and grace you have come to know here. I am blessed in that here in our congregation, I can see both the forest and the trees!

When I walk through a forest, I am aware of the tangle of roots, how one tree is connected to another. Trees use these networks, secretly talking to each other through their roots, passing information along. Adult trees share their sugars with young saplings, a dying tree can send its remaining resources back out to help the community. These networks, these roots of abundance, keep trees in place just as much as they free them to grow and share.

The theme of our annual pledge campaign this year is *Rooted in Abundance*, and we are reminded that we are a mighty forest comprised of ancient trunks and sprightly saplings, each of us contributing our gifts to a world that needs us. As you hear the messages and stories of abundance this year, take note of how generosity spreads and widens our root structures of faith and action.

VESTRY

The Vestry met on Tuesday, August 20th at 5:30pm. Fr. Joe opened with prayer. The Vestry listened to a presentation on stewardship given by Beth Kang and Fr. Joe. Reports were given by all clergy and officers. Jeanie Slates, Senior Warden, reported that the Love Lunches Feeding program was a success. The committee is still in the process of collecting the data and reviewing for next steps. A full report should be available in September. The Vestry discussed the need to get bids on updating our security cameras. A discussion was held about the roof of the church. The Vestry is having several roofers to come for an inspection to give an unbiased opinion on the state of the roof. The Vestry just wants to know without doubt of the shape that it is in. After 8 months of prayer and discussion a motion was made to allocate \$150,000 over the next three year (50k per year) period for the addition of a Parish Administrator to the staff.

The monies allocated for the funding of this additional staff position comes from a bequest to Grace. It is the hope of the Vestry to build this into the future budget of the parish. The Parish Administrator will be responsible for all digital platforms and communications of the parish and daily administer the regular functions of the parish. It is Fr. Joes', and the Vestry, belief that this position will allow for both clergy to have a significant increase in ability to focus on pastoral care, formation and the liturgical life of the parish. They believe that the benefits will be felt and seen immediately. The next Vestry meeting is set for Tuesday, Sept. 10th @ 5:30pm.

Septiembre mes de la Herencia Hispana

En lugar de comenzar a principios de septiembre, el Mes de la Herencia Hispana se celebra durante 30 días a partir del día 15, un guiño a los aniversarios de la independencia nacional de varios países latinoamericanos: Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras y Nicaragua reconocen el 15 de septiembre como la fecha de su independencia, mientras que la independencia de México se celebra el 16 de septiembre y la de Chile el 18 de septiembre.

La historia del Mes de la Herencia Hispana se remonta a 1968, cuando la celebración duraba solo una semana. El presidente Lyndon B. Johnson firmó una ley que designaba la semana del 15 de septiembre como “Semana Nacional de la Herencia Hispana”, según la Oficina del Historiador y la Oficina de Arte y Archivos de la Cámara de Representantes de Estados Unidos.

En la declaración inaugural, escribió sobre la “gran contribución a nuestra herencia nacional hecha por nuestra gente de ascendencia hispana, no solo en los campos de la cultura, los negocios y la ciencia, sino también a través de su valor en la batalla”.

Algunos de los empresarios hispanos más exitosos de Estados Unidos

“Ese fue un período en el que, sin duda, los chicanos del suroeste, los mexicanoestadounidenses y los latinos de todo el país exigían una mayor inclusión y representación política, cultural, social, económica... de todo”, dijo Geraldo Cadava, profesor de historia y de estudios latinos en la Universidad de Northwestern y autor de “The Hispanic Republican”.

“Era una demanda de mayor inclusión y representación y el reconocimiento de que los latinos juegan un papel importante en Estados Unidos”, afirmó.

No fue sino hasta casi 20 años después que la Semana de la Herencia Hispana se alargó a un mes entero bajo el mandato del presidente Ronald Reagan.

El congresista Esteban Torres, de California, presentó un proyecto de ley para ampliarla, diciendo en sus comentarios de entonces: “Queremos que el público sepa que compartimos un legado con el resto del país, un legado que incluye artistas, escritores, campeones olímpicos y líderes en los negocios, el gobierno, el cine y la ciencia”.

El proyecto de ley de Torres se detuvo en la comisión, pero el senador Paul Simon, de Illinois, presentó un proyecto de ley similar que Reagan convirtió en ley.

Las contribuciones de los hispanos y latinos a Estados Unidos son amplias y llenas de historia: Key señaló que la primera colonia conocida en EE.UU. no fue Jamestown, sino la colonia española de San Agustín en Florida.

“Los hispanos o latinos... han luchado en todas las guerras desde la Revolución Estadounidense”, comentó. “Son dueños de negocios y veteranos y maestros y servidores públicos”.

Y añadió: “Los latinos son estadounidenses y forman parte de este tejido”.
