## **VESTRY**

At the recent vestry meeting, several important updates were shared. The sacristy floor installation is underway, with trim needed by Sept. 16th for the Bishop Candidates' Meet and Greet. Fr. Joe reported that the Parish Administrator position has four applicants, with one interview completed. The vestry is encouraged to serve as table leaders for the Parish Stewardship Breakfast on Sept. 22.

Paige Rhymer has been hired as the new sexton, and Fr. Joe is pleased to announce a \$6,000 grant and a \$4,000 donation for the food program.

In property news, the roof will need to be replaced due to faulty installation at some point even though there is no leaking or other problems currently, and bids are being gathered.

The playground and butterfly garden projects are also moving forward, with the Hess family committed to maintaining the VBS Butterfly Garden.

Lastly, discussions on a new Legacy Society initiative are ongoing.

## Promesas de Dios.

Según algunas estimaciones, hay alrededor de 5,000 promesas de Dios en la Biblia. Nuestro Dios es un Dios que hace promesas y cuando las hace, las cumple. Dios hizo promesas a todos los principales líderes de la Biblia, como Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, David, Daniel y Pablo.

“Dios no es un hombre, por lo tanto, no miente. Él no es humano, por lo tanto, no cambia de parecer. ¿Alguna vez prometió sin cumplir?” Números 23:19

Puedes basar tu vida en una variedad de factores diferentes, desde tu propia inteligencia, estudios, hasta tu propio talento y experiencia. Pero también puedes elegir basar tu vida en las promesas de Dios. He aquí algunas de las promesas importantes de Dios.

**No estaré Solo:** Al encontrarnos frente a diversas adversidades debemos recordar lo que dice Isaías 43:2 “Cuando pases por las aguas, yo estaré contigo; y si por los ríos, no te anegarán.” Esto me da seguridad y confianza que no estoy solo.

**Viviré muchos Años:** En Proverbios 3:2-3 dice: “¡Nunca permitas que la lealtad ni la bondad te abandonen! Si así lo haces, vivirás muchos años, y tu vida te dará satisfacción”. Hay una correlación directa en vivir una vida de respeto hacia los demás y la promesa de vivir muchos años con satisfacción, pues habrá paz por todas partes.

**Cosecharé Bendición:** En Gálatas 6:9 dice “Así que no nos cansemos de hacer el bien. A su debido tiempo, cosecharemos numerosas bendiciones si no nos damos por vencidos”. Esta promesa nos asegura que si trabajamos diligentemente y no nos damos por vencidos Dios promete bendiciones para mi vida.

**Tendré Descanso y Paz:** Esto es lo que menos encontramos en el mundo moderno en que vivimos y por ello Jesus enfatizo esta promesa en Mateo 11:28 “Vengan a mí todos los que están cansados y llevan cargas pesadas, y yo les daré descanso”.

**Tendré vida después de la Muerte:** Posiblemente una de las más poderosas promesas es que hay vida después de la muerte porque Jesus dice en Juan 14:2-3 “Voy, pues, a preparar lugar para vosotros. Y si me fuere y os preparare lugar, vendré otra vez, y os tomaré a mí mismo, para que donde yo estoy, vosotros también estéis”.

Dios es un Dios de pactos y promesas y lo más importante es que El cumple. Josue lo experimento diciendo en Josue 21:45 “Ni una sola de todas las buenas promesas que el Señor le había hecho a la familia de Israel quedó sin cumplirse; todo lo que él había dicho se hizo realidad”.
