Living the Mission: Restoring All People to Unity in Christ

On page 855 of the Book of Common Prayer, a single sentence captures the heartbeat of our faith and the purpose of the Church:

"The mission of the Church is to restore all people

to write with Cod and each other in Christ."

"The mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ."

This is not merely an aspirational slogan. It is the mission of the Church universal, meaning it is also our mission, here at Grace Church. This short sentence contains a powerful charge, one that calls us into deep reflection and courageous action. Let's break it down. To restore implies that something has been broken. Relationships, between people, between communities, between humanity and God, have been strained or even shattered. The Church's role is not to avoid this brokenness, but to step into it with the healing, reconciling love of Christ. Restoration doesn't mean returning to the way things used to be; it means moving forward into the wholeness God desires for us. To restore all people means just that: all people. Not just the people we already know. Not just those who look like us, vote like us, think like us, or worship like us. It includes those we struggle to understand, those who challenge us, those who have been hurt by the Church, and those who aren't even sure if they believe. The mission is as expansive as the love of God, and that love knows no boundaries. And what are we restoring people to? To unity with God and each other in Christ. That's not about uniformity or agreement on every issue. It's about communion, about recognizing that, in Christ, we are one Body. It is Christ who binds us together, across difference, disagreement, and division. This mission must shape the way we worship, the way we serve, and the way we speak to and about one another. It challenges us to go beyond comfort and habit, and to reach out in compassion, honesty, and humility. It invites us to forgive, to listen, and to hope. And it reminds us that we are never doing this work alone. The Holy Spirit is always moving, always stirring hearts, always making a way for unity to take root and flourish. At Grace Church, we live out this mission every time we welcome the stranger, serve the hungry, sit beside the grieving, baptize a child, or pass the peace. We live out this mission when we choose love over fear, mercy over judgment, and relationship over rivalry. The mission of the Church is not something we have; it's something we do. It's something we are. And it is as urgent and necessary now as ever. So let us pray for the courage to live into this mission fully. Let us ask God to show us where restoration is needed in our lives, in our church, and in our world. And let us commit, together, to being a community where all people, all people, can be drawn into the unity of Christ's redeeming love.

# JESUCRISTO ÚNICO SALVADOR

La misión universal de la Iglesia nace de la fe en Jesucristo, tal como se expresa en la profesión de fe trinitaria: "Creo en un solo Señor, Jesucristo, Hijo único de Dios, nacido del Padre antes de todos los siglos... Por nosotros, los hombres, y por nuestra salvación bajó del cielo y, por obra del Espíritu Santo, se encarnó de María, la Virgen, y se hizo hombre" 5 En el hecho de la Redención está la salvación de todos, "porque cada uno ha sido comprendido en el misterio de la Redención y con cada uno Cristo se ha unido, para siempre, por medio de este misterio" 6 Sólo en la fe se comprende y se fundamenta la misión. "Nadie va al Padre sino por mí" (Jn 14, 6)

Remontándonos a los orígenes de la Iglesia, vemos afirmado claramente que Cristo es el único Salvador de la humanidad, el único en condiciones de revelar a Dios y de guiar hacia Dios. A las autoridades religiosas judías que interrogan a los Apóstoles sobre la curación del tullido realizada por Pedro, éste responde: "Por el nombre de Jesucristo, el Nazareno, a quien vosotros crucificasteis y a quien Dios resucitó de entre los muertos; por su nombre y no por ningún otro se presenta éste aquí sano delante de vosotros... Porque no hay bajo el cielo otro nombre dado a los hombres por el que nosotros debamos salvarnos" (Act 4, 10. 12). Esta afirmación, dirigida al Sanedrín, asume un valor universal, ya que para todos judíos y gentiles la salvación no puede venir más que de Jesucristo. La universalidad de esta salvación en Cristo es afirmada en todo el Nuevo Testamento San Pablo reconoce en Cristo resucitado al Señor: "Pues escribe él aun cuando se les dé el nombre de dioses, bien en el cielo, bien en la tierra, de forma que hay multitud de dioses y señores, para nosotros no hay más que un solo Dios, el Padre, del cual proceden todas las cosas y para el cual somos; y un solo Señor, Jesucristo, por quien son todas las cosas y por el cual somos nosotros" (1 Cor 8, 5-6). Se confiesa a un único Dios y a un único Señor en contraste con la multitud de "dioses" y "señores" que el pueblo admitía. Pablo reacciona contra el politeísmo del ambiente religioso de su tiempo y pone de relieve la característica de la fe cristiana: fe en un solo Dios y en un solo Señor, enviado por Dios. En el Evangelio de san Juan esta universalidad salvífica de Cristo abarca los aspectos de su misión de gracia, de verdad y de revelación: "La Palabra es la luz verdadera que ilumina a todo hombre" (cf. Jn 1, 9). Y añade: "A Dios nadie lo ha visto jamás; el Hijo único, que está en el seno del Padre, él lo ha revelado" (Jn 1, 18; cf. Mt 11, 27). La revelación de Dios se hace definitiva y completa por medio de su Hijo unigénito: "Muchas veces y de muchos modos habló Dios en el pasado a nuestros Padres por medio de los Profetas; en estos últimos tiempos nos ha hablado por medio del Hijo a quien instituyó heredero de todo, por quien también hizo los mundos" (Heb 1, 1-2; cf. Jn 14, 6).

Q. How does the Church pursue its mission?

A. The Church pursues its mission as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love.

~The Book of Common Prayer, page 855

As we continue to reinforce and build upon our understanding of the mission of the church, we must also ask how does the Church pursue this mission? Thankfully, the answer, is relatively pretty simple. The Church restores all people to unity with God and each other in Christ, by upholding that which we vowed in our baptismal covenant. That we would pursue a life that is rooted in prayer and worship, by proclaiming the good news of Jesus to all those in whom we encounter by word and deed. Communicating the good news of Jesus Christ will be different for each and every one of us, and thanks be to God for that reality, for in each of us is the grace and love of God affirming that we are worthy and capable of doing great things. Great things in the face of injustices by speaking up and out against the principalities which perpetrate them, and recognizing our own need to repent at times of the very same. Peoples are unified in peace over and above that which separates them, especially when we begin to recognize the face of Christ in all people, knowing that unity amongst peoples does not mean conformity to one thing or another, at the loss of another, but seeking that which holds us in common being the love of God. Ultimately reaching reconciliation with God and one another through promoting justice and seeking peace, which is the pursuit of love, and beloved if we are the living body of Christ, then love really is the reality which we must all condition a life worth living around.

Stewardship- It's not just about the church budget

Grace's 2025-2026 "Tell Out My Soul" \* Stewardship campaign is not solely about balancing the budget. In reality, parishes should do stewardship formation and their budget process apart from each other. Yes, the amount of pledge income will affect the budget, but in the end, we do not gather pledge income so that we might have balanced budgets. We do stewardship campaigns to help people learn about the generosity and hospitality of Jesus Christ. Yes, our church budget is important but we also want to focus on making mindful choices with our time, talents and treasures in our daily lives Stewardship is about being grateful, responsible stewards of the gifts we receive from God.

**Building Relationships out of Abundance Instead of Scarcity** 

The tradition of giving back to God and to the church comes from the Biblical practice of "tithing," which means to give back a tenth of our earnings to God (Numbers 18:26). The Episcopal Church sees stewardship as more than simply contributing money to the church; it's also about contributing and volunteering for Grace's mission and ministries. At the end of the day, what is most important is reaching out to build relationships with each other from a perspective of abundance instead of scarcity.

Intentionality

Over the summer months, I challenge you to think about Stewardship as primarily about "intentionality." Intentionality means moving beyond pledging out of a passive obligation to being an active disciple of Christ. When we are deliberate about choosing to support Grace Church's mission and ministries, we are giving from a place of joy as a response to God's love.

To be a successful steward means we care for, provide for and contribute to something because we find value in it. It means that it is important enough to us that we aren't giving from a place of what we simply have left over. Let's begin to be intentional about making choices regarding what we want our pledge (our time, talent and treasure) to go toward.

Let's "Tell Out Our Souls" by being intentional about our sharing our gifts rooted in faith, gratitude and love of Christ.

The Vestry met on May 20.

The clergy shared updates on the consecration of Bishop Amy Meaux. Fr. Jose Palma is working on the preparations for the Hispanic Multi-Diocesan Retreat, to be held in July. The Senior Warden (Jeanie Slates) reminded everyone that the next Coffee with the Vestry is scheduled for June 22. Everyone is encouraged to attend! Plans are coming together for a Stewardship Drive, tentatively scheduled for late September through October. Building maintenance continues with recent plumbing repairs, and upcoming plans for painting the apse. Plans are in place to replace the broken basketball goal in the parking lot and repair a damaged pew in the Nave.

Financially, April was not a good month. We are down \$21,000. A transfer of \$25,000 from operating funds was necessary to cover upcoming expenses. On a positive note, we were able to send our \$4,000 annual contribution to the school in Haiti we support. Improvements were made to our security system that is expected to save about \$8,000 annually.

The Lunches of Love program is preparing to begin our second year of donating food to Carthage school children. Banners have been ordered to promote the program, which will hand out two bags of food to each child every week. Volunteers to help run this program are welcome! See the sign-up sheets on the table in the Parish House.

Vacation Bible School plans are also underway, and volunteers are needed! VBS will be held for children in K-5th grades on June 18, 19, and 20. The Vestry also approved an expenditure of up to \$2,000 to provide scholarships for Grace Church youth to attend the Episcopal Summer Mega Camp.

The Vestry endorsed Jory Mertens as a candidate for ordination to the Diaconate. His ordination is expected to take place in January 2026.
