In my last article, I reflected on how the Book of Common Prayer defines the mission of the Church: “*to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ*” (BCP, p. 855). This profound statement reminds us that the Church does not exist for itself—it exists for the sake of the world. We are called to participate in God’s reconciling love, healing what is broken and drawing all things into Christ.

But how do we actually carry out that mission?

The Prayer Book continues: “*The Church pursues its mission as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love.*” These three movements—worship, proclamation, and compassion—form the heart of our life as the Body of Christ.

We pray and worship.

Worship is not simply a weekly routine—it is where we encounter the living God. In liturgy, we are nourished by Word and Sacrament, shaped by rhythms of praise, confession, and grace. Worship draws us into the life of the Trinity and sends us out renewed to reflect that divine love in the world.

We proclaim the Gospel.

To proclaim the Gospel is to bear witness to the good news of Jesus in all we do. Through Christ, God is redeeming creation, reconciling sinners, and making all things new. We proclaim this Gospel not just from the pulpit, but with every act of kindness, every word of truth, and every choice to love our neighbor.

We promote justice, peace, and love.

God’s mission becomes visible when we care for the poor, stand with the marginalized, seek reconciliation, and insist on the dignity of every human being. Each act of service, no matter how small, participates in God’s work of restoration.

The mission of the Church is not just something we believe—it is something we live. Every time we worship, serve, forgive, or proclaim hope, we are becoming the Church God dreams us to be.

Los secretos del reino de los cielos y el misterio de Dios

En la primera venida de Jesús, había personas como Tomás que ciegamente dudaban de lo que no vieron con sus propios ojos, y algunas personas seguían dudando hasta justo antes de que Jesús ascendiera al cielo en el monte de los Olivos, estando presentes allí llenos de dudas. Sin embargo, también podemos ver en la Biblia que los discípulos como Pedro, Juan y Santiago, reconocieron la luz de la gloria de Cristo y lo siguieron hasta el final.

La Biblia dice: “Porque a vosotros os es dado saber los misterios del reino de los cielos; mas a ellos no les es dado”, y: “A fin de conocer el misterio de Dios el Padre, y de Cristo”. Si consideramos estas palabras, podemos ver que el misterio del reino de los cielos es dado a los que reconocen a Cristo como el misterio de Dios y lo reciben. Como miembros de la familia celestial, prosigamos en conocer a Dios para descubrir todos los secretos del reino de los cielos y vivir siempre bajo la protección de Dios, permaneciendo en sus promesas.

“Entonces, acercándose los discípulos, le dijeron: ¿Por qué les hablas por parábolas? El respondiendo, les dijo: Porque a vosotros os es dado saber los misterios del reino de los cielos; mas a ellos no les es dado. Porque a cualquiera que tiene, se le dará, y tendrá más; pero al que no tiene, aun lo que tiene le será quitado. Por eso les hablo por parábolas: porque viendo no ven, y oyendo no oyen, ni entienden.” Mt. 13:10-13

Jesús dijo que hay personas a quienes les es dado saber los misterios del reino de los cielos, y aquellos a quienes no les es dado. ¿Por qué Dios, que es justo, da a conocer solo a algunas personas el misterio del reino de los cielos?

No solo existen los hijos de Dios, sino también las fuerzas del mal. Si una serpiente bebe agua, produce veneno, pero si una vaca bebe agua, produce leche. Entonces, la misma cosa puede producir algo bueno o malo según quién lo use. Asimismo, hay aquellos a quienes se les debe dar los misterios del reino de los cielos, y aquellos a quienes no se les debe dar. Es por eso que Dios enseñó todo por parábolas. Ya que los humanos solos no pueden resolver las parábolas, Dios personalmente vino a esta tierra para enseñar lo que quiere decir a través de las parábolas. De esa manera, la Biblia profetiza que muchos pueblos correrán a Sion para aprender el camino de la vida de Dios y seguir ese camino (Is. 2:2-3, Mi. 4:1-22).

Beginning Wednesday September 3rd, Catechism Classes will be offered every Wednesday night following our 6:00 pm Mass unless otherwise noted. This class is going to focus on learning the Catechism of the Episcopal Church which can be found in the Book of Common Prayer in the section titled “An Outline of the Faith”. If you desire to be confirmed, regular Catechesis is the first step towards Confirmation at Grace Episcopal Church. If youth wish to participate for the purpose of confirmation rather than attending youth group for a period that is perfectly acceptable.

Our formation series entitled ‘*Exploring the Way*’ will continue on Sunday mornings at 9:30 am. Items or materials related to this series will be announced parish wide as necessary.

There will no longer be Sunday School for Elementary aged youth on Sundays at 9:30 am. Instead, we are trying something new as a parish. During the 10:30 am service there will be a Children’s Chapel offering. Youth through grade 5 or homeschool equivalent, will be invited forward to receive a blessing from the clergy after our opening hymn where they will then be sent to Chapel. During Chapel, youth will have the opportunity to participate in an activity centered around the liturgical season or theme of the lectionary. An usher will notify the group in Chapel when it is time for them to return after the peace, before/during parish announcements. If you would be interested in helping with this ministry, or have any questions, please reach out to your clergy.

Wednesday night Youth group will continue as it did in the previous program year with 6:00 pm Mass, dinner, and fellowship. If you are interested in being a volunteer with our Youth Program please reach out to the church and ask for Fr. Collin.

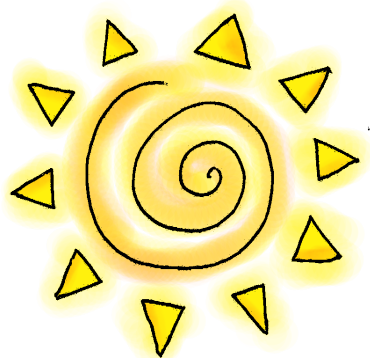

The Vestry met on June 17.

Items of note included a discussion about the Episcopad and the need to keep it maintained. Several items within the house (e.g., cabinets, countertops, wiring) are aging and need to be updated to prevent deterioration. The formation of a building and grounds committee was proposed, which would include the Episcopad. Further conversation will take place regarding the creation of the committee.

Fr. Collin is gathering information on solar panels and will present at a later date. No plans are in motion at this time; it is an option that is being explored.

The Stewardship Committee is planning a kick-off for Sunday, September 21. There will be one service on that morning at 10 a.m., followed by a cook-out. Parishioners are encouraged to consider prayerfully what they will be able to pledge in the coming year.

The Vestry voted to accept a quote from ABE Painting to paint the apse in the sanctuary; the painting will be done in July. The decision was made to purchase a new basketball goal; Zach Hess and Ben Blair will get it installed.

Lunches of Love is ready to begin its second year of operation; food donations have been identified and communications to the public are organized.

Under new business, a deanery grant was approved to buy new hymnals for St. Luke's. They are in a PDF format and the Vestry approved a request for \$300 to have them printed, with the money coming from the Phelps Outreach Fund. That fund will also be used to provide \$400 to purchase new library furnishings.

Michelle Theerman is looking into having a booth at PrideFest in Joplin, in September. Grace parishioners will be invited to help.

In financial news, pledge income is down. As expected, we are down about \$15,000 ytd. We are operating more efficiently than in years past; postage, phone bill, and communications expenses are all down in comparison to last year as new cost savings are identified.

The Vestry held a working session in July to begin discussion on the 2026 budget.

Update on 2025 budget:

At the end of June, the total YTD income was \$229,980.56 which includes pledge, non-pledge, bequests, and special offerings with total YTD expenses being \$278,363.14 resulting in a deficit of \$48,382.58. At the end of June, we had budgeted for a deficit of \$66,862.00. At this time, the church remains slightly ahead of budget.
