Beloved,

As Christians we are story tellers. We have an ancient narrative, one that describes the beginning of time and the relationship between God and God's Creation. We see this story grow through the prophetic tradition until our story recounts the life and gifts of the Son of God. But the story doesn't end with the Resurrection just as it did not end with the Cross, it continues on in each of us today as we encounter and are transformed by the Good News.

Luke's Gospel is bookended by the animated story-telling of two women named Mary. Early in the Gospel, Mary the mother of Jesus, tells us of her encounter with the Divine who informs her that she will bear a child who will change the world. She proclaims her joy: "Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!" At the end of the Gospel, another Mary, Mary Magdalene, visits the tomb to discover it empty and receives instructions from the Risen Christ to go tell the others. She carries this Good News with jubilance to the Disciples.

What is your Good News; the idea, dream, challenge placed in your heart by God, that needs to be shared? What is the ministry to which you are called which will change the world, sharing your talents, gifts, and love with your neighbors?

Our Stewardship Campaign this year focuses on these stories – the ones inside you, the ones you are still writing, the ones we tell about those who have gone before us. We are all a part of this ongoing narrative - the ongoing Creation. As you pray about how you will share your gifts with us this year, think about how God is calling you to tell out your soul, to spread the Good News far and wide. Hear the stories that we share weekly throughout the campaign that relate the creative spark in us with the ways in which we are called to serve God and love our neighbor.

A Faithful Approach to Pledging

As we enter this season of stewardship guided by the hymn theme "Tell Out My Soul," we are invited to pause and prayerfully reflect on what it means to make a pledge. At its heart, pledging is not merely

a financial decision—it is an act of gratitude, faith, and trust in God's abundance.

When we consider "how much" to pledge, the first question isn't about numbers on a page. It begins instead with gratitude. What blessings has God poured into your life this year? Where have you experienced God's sustenance, mercy, and love? Our pledge becomes one way of telling out our souls in thanks—a tangible response of gratitude to the Giver of all things.

Pledging also calls us to deeper faith. For some, the decision may feel uncertain—even daunting. Yet at its core, a pledge proclaims: "I believe God will provide." We give not from fear of scarcity but from

trust in God's abundance, knowing that our lives are held securely in His care.

Of course, the size of our pledges matters—because together our gifts sustain the ministry, mission, and daily life of Grace Episcopal Church. Your giving helps nourish: Lunches of Love; Caring for residents at St. Luke's; Our Blessing Box; Grace's Church Garden; Our Lending Library; Meals on Wheels; Support for Haiti; Episcopal Relief & Development Fund. Each of these ministries is a living expression of Christ's love—and each depends on the generosity of faithful pledges.

As we have shared throughout the year, stewardship is not just a moment or a single decision, but a lifelong journey. It is the daily practice of noticing God's gifts, using them wisely, and returning them joyfully in gratitude. Please continue this way of life, not only during pledge season but in all the ways

we share our time, talents, and treasures throughout the year.

Still, even more foundational than the dollar amount is the spirit in which it is given. Every pledge, no matter the size, represents a holy offering. Together, these individual commitments weave a stronger and more vibrant future for our parish community. Together, they announce that we believe in God's abundance—and in His call to share it.

As you discern your own pledge, take time for prayer. Ask yourself: How has God blessed me, and how can my giving reflect my gratitude?

What level of generosity would express my trust in God's ongoing abundance?

How might my pledge embody both thanksgiving for the past and hope for the future?

In the end, pledging is part of living faithfully—not out of obligation, but out of joy. To pledge is to participate in God's song of abundance, where gratitude becomes action and hope becomes ministry. It is how we, as members of Grace, "tell out our souls" and bear witness to the mighty works God continues to do in and through us.

May your discernment be prayerful, your decision faithful, and your pledge abundant with thanksgiv-

For those of you with families, consider incorporating your children into this journey of stewardship. Involve them in serving meals, tending the church garden, sharing household generosity, or offering prayers of thanksgiving. These simple practices teach children that giving is an expression of faith and that their offerings, too, are part of God's abundance flowing into the world.

Family Stewardship at Home

Simple ways to involve children all year long

- Gratitude Jar Write weekly thank you notes and read them together.
- Family Service Volunteer together at church or in the community.
- Share Allowances/Gifts Encourage children to set aside part for giving.
- Prayer of Thanks Let children lead a short blessing at meals or bedtime. Seasonal Giving – Choose one project during Advent/Lent to practice generosity.

Stewardship becomes a way of life when families learn to practice gratitude, generosity, and service together joyfully, all year long.

The Purpose of the Grace Endowment Fund (currently about \$2,600,000) is to enable Grace Episcopal Church to fulfill its mission in addition to what is possible through the operating funds that are generated by the annual Stewardship Campaign. The endowment is increasingly important in enabling Grace to fulfill its mission. For that reason, the Vestry has authorized the formation of the Grace Legacy Society.

The Purpose of the Grace Legacy Society is to recognize those who have remembered Grace Church in their estate plans. However, the more important function of the Legacy Society is to enable and empower our members to witness to the value of Grace in their lives and to secure the ministries of the Church for generations to come.

To Become a Member...

You may become a member of the Grace Legacy Society simply by notifying the church that you have made a provision in your estate plans for a gift to Grace Episcopal Church. This may include a bequest of money, securities, personal property, or real estate in your will or estate plan, a life income gift, a gift of life insurance, or another type of planned gift. Neither the size nor type of gift matters. What matters is that you have made the provision in your estate plan.

As a Member...

With the materials you receive today you will find an invitation of acceptance from the Grace Lagacy Society to fill out and return to the church office. Once we receive your acceptance you will receive more information. You will also become another witness in the long line leading back to earlier donors to the Endowment Fund who recognized the importance of using their accumulated resources to support the ministries of Grace for generations to come.

In addition, you will become part of a group of Grace Episcopal Church members who...

- Meet periodically to discuss the ministries of the church and share a meal;
- Sponsor and participate in seminars and special events that share information on the various means of planned giving and issues related to estate planning; and
- Sponsor a memorial that recognizes these witnesses and reminds the congregation of the importance of legacy stewardship.
